Locally agreed syllabus

The Suffolk Locally Agreed Syllabus for RE was reviewed in 2012 and is available through <u>www.suffolklearning.co.uk</u> Hard copies of the syllabus were made available for those attending the Suffolk RE Conference and Autumn networks.

Support for implementing the locally agreed syllabus

Materials to support the implementation of the agreed syllabus have been prepared, including an enquiry framework to support curriculum planning.

There are termly network meetings run in north, south and west Suffolk to share resources and materials for the agreed syllabus.

Key practitioners are funded for projects to develop curriculum units to support the agreed syllabus. This is on going and will be made available at the Suffolk RE Conference in 2014.

Suffolk SACRE supported the 'Gandhi, King Ikeda' exhibition at Suffolk New College through releasing teachers to prepare classroom resources to develop the themes of the exhibition. They were supported in this by SACRE member Janus van Helvert.

SACRE was also grateful to receive funding from the Suffolk Environment Strategy team to work with teachers on materials to support Environmental Sustainability. These are available on the Suffolk Learning website.

Suffolk SACRE was successful in its bid to NASACRE to develop materials for faith artefact boxes. This became a research project with pupils in primary schools investigating the significance of the artefacts, moderated by students in a secondary school and made available to schools across the county.

The annual Suffolk RE Conference is the principal event for promoting the principles and expectations for the RE syllabus. These messages are then consolidated through the termly network meetings.

Standards in RE

2013

A Level: 182 students were entered: 55% achieved A*-B A/S Level: 53 students were entered: 34% achieved A-B GCSE Full course: 1877 were entered: 64% achieved A*-C GCSE Short course: 2621 were entered: 52% achieved A*-C

GCSE entries have fallen slightly since 2012, full course results the same as 2012 and an improvement from 45% for short course.

RE Quality Mark
