This LB Camden SACRE Annual Report is presented in the new format developed by NASACRE in conjunction with the DfE for use from September 2021.

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1. Introduction

1.1 Foreword from the Chair of SACRE 2020-21

Camden SACRE continues to fulfil its statutory duties in what has been another challenging year for schools.

There has been a good attendance at meetings online and a number of new members have joined SACRE this academic year. This has ensured that the SACRE remains reflective of the local community and has representatives on the board, from the major world faith and worldviews. Where there remain vacancies, members are actively looking to fill them.

The self-evaluation toolkit continues to ensure the work of the SACRE remains focused and key priorities identified.

A number of schools apply for determinations from offering a broadly Christian daily act of worship in their schools. SACRE members have taken time to carefully consider all applications and have appropriately challenged where necessary.

A working party has been set up to look more in depth at how Religious Education is taught within the borough and explore ways in which SACRE can support and advance the teaching of RE. This is very much a work in progress and the impact on the working party's work will be evaluated in due course.

May I take this opportunity to thank all SACRE members for their commitment and willingness to sit on this advisory body. SACRE has an important role to play in ensuring all pupils and students attending Community schools in Camden, receive a quality education in RE and experience high quality collective worship thus enabling them to flourish as holistically.

2. Religious Education Statutory Responsibilities

2.1 Background

The London Borough of Camden's Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education (SACRE) is required, in accordance with Section 391(6) of the Education Act 1996, to publish an annual report on its activities. This report summarises its activities during the academic year 2020-21. Its current terms of reference, as laid down by the Education Reform Act 1998, are: "to advise the authority upon such matters connected with religious worship in county schools and the religious education to be given in accordance with an agreed syllabus as the authority may refer to the council or as the council may see fit."

In particular, the SACRE is charged with the following responsibilities:

- It can require the authority to review the Agreed Syllabus on Religious Education.
- It may determine, on application by the headteacher that the requirement for Collective Worship in community schools to be wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character shall not apply to the Collective Worship provided for some or all of its pupils in a particular school.
- With the authority, to review the support offered for RE teaching, the methods of teaching employed, and teachers' in-service professional development.

In addition, the SACRE has a direct role in the consideration and disposal of complaints related to the RE curriculum or Collective Worship. The SACRE will be asked to advise where complaints relate to Religious Education given in accordance with the locally agreed syllabus or to Collective Worship in county – now called community - schools.

2.2 Locally Agreed Syllabus

By statute, every local authority is required to adopt a Locally Agreed Syllabus (LAS) for Religious Education and to review it every five years. The current LB of Camden LAS has been in place since 2018, after undergoing a rigorous process of review and revision in conjunction with colleagues in Hampshire from where the LAS was adopted. The version used in LB of Camden (and three other LAs in London) has been adapted from the original to reflect the demographics of our capital city.

2.3 Standards in RE

SACRE members gave close consideration to the various national and local developments concerning the provision of RE. These discussions were prompted by the information provided to the SACRE through the regular updates from the RE Consultant and SACRE Adviser and NASACRE Briefings.

2.4 Teacher Training

Lesley Prior (the RE Consultant and Adviser to SACRE) offers extensive telephone and online consultations to Subject Leaders who are developing schemes of learning and reviewing and revising policy documents for RE. In addition, Lesley issued six newsletters during this period (one every half term) for distribution to Subject Leaders to share new materials and resources, promote relevant RE events and highlight significant national developments and initiatives in the subject. SACRE members also receive these newsletters.

2.5 Complaints and Withdrawals

There have been no complaints to SACRE in 2020-21 in relation to Religious Education.

3. Collective Worship Statutory Responsibilities

3.1. Standards and Monitoring of Collective Worship

During 2020-21 SACRE was unable to monitor Collective Worship provision fully because of the restraints imposed by the pandemic.

3.2 Determinations

The Adviser to SACRE regularly reminds members about the role, nature and purpose of determinations in relation to Collective Worship.

In 2020-21, the following schools received a determination in relation to Collective Worship:

- Brecknock School (expires summer 2026)
- Primrose Hill Primary School (expires summer 2026)
- Regent High School (expires summer 2026)
- Rhyl Primary School (expires summer 2026)
- Torriano Primary School

3.3 Other Information

There have been no complaints to SACRE in 2020-21 in relation to Collective Worship.

SACRE has received no reports of pupils being withdrawn from Collective Worship in

2020-21.

4. Links with other Bodies

6.2 Professional and Administrative Support

Secretarial assistance and a budget for the discharge of the SACRE's duties is provided by the LB Camden. The key areas of this support include the following:

- Provision of a Clerk
- Support of a Local Authority Adviser
- Commissioning of an RE Consultant and Adviser to the SACRE
- Funding of the NASACRE annual membership
- Funding for at least one SACRE member to attend NASACRE's annual Conference and AGM

- The licensing of the Agreed Syllabus
- The work of the RE Consultant, purchased from the London Diocesan Board for Schools, including the cost of supporting the Primary RE Network
- Officer time from London Borough of Camden and Camden Learning Ltd
- Costs such as membership of NASACRE, and attendance at the NASACRE Conference etc.

Further funding and officer time is available for the development of the SACRE and its work if needed.
