The SACRE is independent of the Local Authority and its main function is to advise the Local Authority upon such matters connected with religious worship in Community and Voluntary Controlled schools. Also, it: -

- can require the Authority to review its current agreed syllabus
- and must consider applications made by a head teacher that the requirement for collective worship in Community schools or Schools which have not been designated as having a religious character to be wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character shall not apply to the collective worship provided for some or all of the pupils at that particular school.

The broad role of the SACRE therefore is to support the effective provision of Religious Education and collective worship in schools.

Meetings held:

19th October 2021 23rd March 2022 29th June 2022

All meetings were held online principally by the Microsoft TEAMS platform. SACRE remains open to offers from faith groups who may wish to host meetings and also a return to occasional face to face meetings is proposed for specific purposes such as visiting speakers.

New Agreed syllabus

As referenced in our last annual report Manchester SACRE agreed to work with Tameside, Trafford, Salford and Stockport in the commissioning of a new Agreed Syllabus from R E Today.

This work came to a conclusion in academic year 21-22 resulting the implementation of the new syllabus in September 2022. This syllabus will remain current until August 2027.

Launch events took place in February and March 2022 which took the form of CPD days led by colleagues from R E Today. Attendance at these events were over 300 teachers.

Following these events all schools were issued with electronic copies of the new syllabus so that they could prepare for teaching in September 2022. The full syllabus is copyright and licensed to the five commissioning authorities however an abridged version is available upon request. Authority.

An outcome of the launch events was a surplus of funds which will be used by the five commissioning authorities in the provision of CPD and resources.

Collective Worship

During the year work with the aid of colleagues from Pennine Learning SACRE has agreed a basic collective worship policy document that can be used and adapted by schools. Work is also in progress to ensure that SACRE has a process to follow should requests for determinations be received from any of its schools.

Greater Manchester Faith and Belief Panel

During the year Manchester SACRE has engaged with this body and our vice chair Cedric Knipe is also member of the panel.

An initial meeting was held on February 14th bringing together officers from a variety of local SACRE's. The intention was to create contacts and look at ways in which SACRE's can work together and with the panel itself.

SACRE's were given the opportunity to highlight their priorities and it was felt that there should be an opportunity to get teachers and students more involved with SACRE's.

It was proposed that SACRE's meet every six months with representatives of the panel.

R.E Data

The resumption of school examinations in summer 2022 means that we are able to present the validated data at the end of this report.

SACRE communication with schools

Through the SACRE LA Officer schools continue to receive regular communications via the Children and Families Directorate School Broadcast Circular system. These communications include notification of events, requests for contact details and training /support materials from SACRE members or other faith organisations.

Provision of information for SACRE members

Manchester SACRE continue to be members of NASACRE and all members have access details to the website, including the regular briefings. OFSTED inspections have recommenced following their temporary suspension during the COVID related period of considerable disruption to school life in 2020/21. Members can view Inspection reports and any R E related comments via the OFSTED website.

SACRE membership

During the period covered by this report academic year Manchester SACRE was pleased to welcome Jenny Chan as a new representative of the Chinese Christian Church replacing Eric Keasberry. It was also reported that SACRE would benefit from representation of the Buddist and Hindu faiths.

Additionally, we lost Ruth Watson from the United Reform Church and Rachel Kemp as a Primary School representative. Both of these colleagues need to be replaced in the coming year.

Manchester SACRE thanks Eric, Ruth and Rachel for their support over a number of years.

Freedom of Information requests (FOI)

SACRE received two FOI request During the period covered by this report. No FOI requests were received by SACRE.

Requests for a determination

SACRE did not receive any requests for determinations with regard to Collective Worship during the period covered by this report. Any school wishing to explore the relevance of a determination (daily collective worship which is other than 'wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character) in their context should contact SACRE via the local authority officer, Nick Paul (n.paul@manchester.gov.uk).Church schools are not eligible for a determination and for an academy wishing to apply for a determination the correct process is for the Trust to apply through the Education Funding Agency (EFA) to the Secretary of State.

Complaints concerning RE

There have been no complaints concerning RE.

Complaints concerning Collective Worship

There have been no complaints received about collective worship.

Finance

SACRE does not have a dedicated budget; however, the LA covers the costs of a professional clerk, meeting costs and the membership of NASACRE. The LA representative on SACRE has the authority to consider requests for financial support for SACRE activities and to authorise payment where funds exist and there is a clear benefit to the role of SACRE
